This has been a busy spring season for COHHIO. I just wanted to take a moment to share with you a few of the things we've been working on lately.

First, the good news: we're making progress on one of COHHIO's main priorities - expanding the [Ohio Housing Trust Fund](#). Working with our allies in the Home Matters to Ohio campaign, we managed to get an amendment in the state budget that would adjust county recording fees to strengthen the Trust Fund.

The Trust Fund amendment still has to survive the Senate's budget process and the governor's veto pen. But we're working to ensure the final budget bill will bolster this critical resource for local homeless and affordable housing programs throughout the state.

The Housing Trust Fund has been one of the state's most effective policy solutions. This amendment will keep us all moving toward the goal of ending homelessness in Ohio. Thanks for doing your part in the community.



## Medicaid Expansion

COHHIO [just released a report](#) detailing how Ohio's move to expand Medicaid in 2014 has made a positive impact on efforts to reduce homelessness. Many of you shared your personal stories, some of which were incorporated into the report - thanks for your help!

Prior to the ACA, Medicaid eligibility was limited to specific low-income groups.



We're sharing our findings with state and federal policymakers, who are considering some drastic changes to the Medicaid program that could seriously hinder the forward progress we've made fighting homelessness in recent years.
