


Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care 2019 Point-in-Time Count PIT Count Tool Overview

The following provides an overview of the 2019 Ohio BoSCoC PIT Count data collection tools. All communities are required to use these tools for conducting both the sheltered and unsheltered count. Additional information and requirements for conducting the 2019 PIT Count can be found in the *Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care 2019 Housing Inventory Count and Point-in-Time Count Guidance* document.

Unsheltered PIT Count Tools

Unsheltered Count Form


To be used for interviewing persons identified during the Street Count
Must be used on January 22, 2019 8:00pm-6:00am the following morning

	UNSHeltered COUNT FORM	Use on: January 22, 2019 8:00pm - 6:00am
		Use for: Street Count interview

Unsheltered Observation Count Form

To be used for collecting data on persons identified during the Street Count that refuse or otherwise cannot be interviewed


Must be used on January 22, 2019 8:00pm-6:00am the following morning

	OBSERVATION COUNT FORM	Use on: January 22, 2019 8:00pm - 6:00am
		Use for: Street Count- <u>only</u> when interview is not possible

Service-Based Count Form

To be used at service-based locations (food banks, meal sights, benefits providers) in the days following the Street Count to collect data on persons who were not identified during the night of the count.

Must be used between January 23-31, 2019

	SERVICE-BASED COUNT FORM	Use on: January 23 - 31, 2019 (days following the Street Count)
		Use for: Persons not identified during Street Count

Sheltered PIT Count Tools

Sheltered Count Form

To be used by non-HMIS participating providers for collecting data on persons entered in their projects.
Must be used on January 22 or January 23, 2018 to collect information for clients who are/were in the project on the night of January 22.

	SHELTERED COUNT FORM	Use on: January 22, 2019
		Use for: Sheltered Count interview (non-HMIS participating providers)

Note: Although each tool has been produced in color to aid in selecting the correct one during the Count, the CoC realizes that most will be printed in black-and-white. The PIT Count organizers may find it helpful to print each form on a different color of paper to achieve this same purpose.
