- 1. Put emergency operations and communication plans into action
- Ensure that clients receive assistance in preventing disease spread and accessing care, as needed

Detailed Recommendations

Connect with local public health department

- Determine what to do if someone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 is in your project
- Determine local isolation/quarantine plan
- Seek out sanitation supplies, masks, etc, if needed

Detailed Recommendations

Prepare Your Space

- 1. Stock-up on Sanitation Supplies
 - Follow CDC guidelines for making disinfecting solutions as needed
- 2. Provide handwashing supplies in bathrooms, kitchens, etc
- 3. Communicate and implement prevention strategies
 - Post signs about hand washing and how to do it
 - Staff wash hands hourly in addition to after using restroom, before meals etc.
 - · Post signs about no handshaking
- 4. Staff use disposable gloves if handling resident/client

Detailed Recommendations

Prepare Your Space - Congregate Facilities

- 1. Beds in sleeping areas should be at least 3 feet part
- 2. Residents sleep head-to-toe or toe-to-toe
- Identify possible area(s) for isolation or quarantine
 Partner with local public health to identify other options, as needed, such as hotels

Prepare Your Space - Congregate Facilities

- 1. Day-time operations
 - Respond to needs of homeless families now that schools are closed

Detailed Recommendations

Managing Staffing and Service Provision

- 1. Develop plans for staff shortages
- 2. Train staff on prevention strategies and all new operations
 - Require hourly handwashing
 - Require disposable gloves when handling resident possessions, including things like IDs taken during intake
- 3. Require staff who are ill to stay home
- 4. All non-essential staff work from home
- 5. Meetings with clients are not in-person, where possible
- When meetings must be in-person, practice social distancing (at least 3 feet apart), or strive to have barriers in place

Managing Staffing and Service Provision

1. Cancel public meetings/services in your buildings

Detailed Recommendations

Managing Entries into Congregate Facilities

- Screen prospective residents for symptoms and possible interaction with people with the infection
- 2. If a possible COVID-19 case is identified, follow the plan you already established with local public health
 - · Report it as appropriate
 - Refer to hospital, if that is the local plan
 - · Connect person to isolation/quarantine space
 - Do NOT simply deny assistance to someone you suspect may have COVID-19

Detailed Recommendations

Additional Considerations for Congregate Facilities

- Develop responses to keep vulnerable residents safe, if COVID-19 cases are occurring locally
 Eg. Move elderly residents, those with underlying medical conditions to hotels temporarily
 Temporarily prioritize RRH assistance for vulnerable shelter residents regardless of past homeless history
- 2. Consider staggering meal times to allow for more social distancing between residents

Additional Considerations for Scattered-Site Projects

- 1. Conduct case management meetings via phone, not in-person
- Check in with elderly and medically vulnerable clients past and present to ensure they have sufficient supplies of food and hygiene products
