

- Emergency Rental Assistance in Ohio is being administered through a program called the Home Relief Grant
- This program makes available \$25 billion to assist households that are unable to pay rent and utilities due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Home Relief Grant program funds are being administered by local Community Action Agencies (CAAs)




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- An eligible household is defined as a renter household in which at least one more more individuals meets the following criteria:
 - Qualifies for unemployment or has experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19
 - Demonstrates a risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability; and
 - Has a household income at or below 80% of the area median.
 - Eligible households may receive up to 12 months of assistance






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- When applying, be prepared to provide:
 - Names of all household members
 - Dates of birth
 - SSN
 - Current or previous address
 - Proof of income for all household members 18+
 - Any supporting documentation to demonstrate need
 - Proof of hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- To receive Rental Assistance, you will also need to provide:
 - Total amount due, including fees
 - If moving to a new location, justification for the move (i.e currently homeless, living with another family, etc)
 - Landlord contact information and lease/rental agreement

- Eligible Costs under ERA program:
 - Rent
 - Utilities
 - Arrearages
- ERA payments must NOT be duplicative of any other federally funded rental assistance provided to an eligible household
 - An eligible household that occupies federally subsidized residental or mixed-use property may receive ERA assistance, provided that ERA funds are not applied to costs that have been or will be reimbursed under any other federal assistance
- ERA funds must prioritize households with incomes less than 50% AMI, or households with one or more individuals that have not been employed for the 90-day period preceding the date of application




