

SOARing Together Series 2: Letter 12 2021 SOAR/SSA Forms

Following and Utilizing the Fidelity of the SOAR Model and Methodology:

Following the SOAR methodology is more important than ever when submitting complete applications packets to the local SSA field offices and Disability Determination Services (DDS), in these ever changing and challenging times. Answering all questions on each form and submitting the forms in the proper order is always essential to the SOAR process. Applications not submitted properly or in the correct order may cause delay in the decision process with both SSA and DDS. With Social Security field offices having limited or closed offices, submitting applications in person or by mail is not an option that will benefit your decision time or your clients need for the expedited process. Request more information on the SOAR Ohio secured email for the quickest and safest way to submit SOAR Ohio assisted claims.

The first three forms (**SSA-3288**, **SSA-827** and **SSA-1696**) are needed for setting the protective filing date (PFD). They should be submitted before you begin working on the claim with your client. As good practice, keep a copy of each to be included in the complete client SOAR Ohio assisted application packet.

SSA-3288: Consent for Release of Information- https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-3288.pdf

This form allows you to receive information from SSA concerning any previous involvement the client may have had with SSA. I.e., Work History for SSDI claim, Prior or Pending claims with SSA as well as an indicator that this client will be filing a SOAR Ohio assisted claim with you and your agency.

SSA-827: Authorization to Disclose Information to SSA- https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-827.pdf

With your client's signature, SSA has permission to gather any medical information for each hospital doctor and treatment center your client has visited.

SSA-1696: Appointment of Representative-https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-1696.pdf

One of the five critical components of the SOAR Method is to act as the client representative.

Once ready to submit applications, be sure to include all forms and that the forms are in correct order. Here is a quick review of the forms and the order that need to be submitted for all SOAR Ohio claims:

SOAR Checklist for Initial Claims-(enclosed)this form identifies claim as a SOAR Ohio assisted claim along with the DDS Homelessness Unit cover sheet.

SSA-8000: Application for Supplemental Security Income (SSI)-

IMPORTANT INFO: the SSA-8000 must be filled out and submitted in paper format with the entire benefits application packet, not online, even if it is suggested by SSA to do the online version. The online version could put the client's claim at risk of not being completely reviewed if this is not their first time filling a claim.

SSA-16: Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and SSA-3368: Adult Disability Report

SSA-3369: Work History Report- https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-3369.pdf

SSA-3373: Function Report- https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-3373-bk.pdf

SOAR Ohio replaces the Medical Summary Report (another critical component of SOAR) with the SSA-3373 as most provider agencies cannot get a signed MSR from a medical provider.

The **Quality Review Checklist**- is another critical component of SOAR and will assist organizing the application.
