The federal Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services Block Grant Program is authorized under Title V of the Social Security Act to ensure the health and well-being of women, mothers, infants, children, including children with special healthcare needs, adolescents, and their families. The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) is the authorized Title V agency in Ohio. Title V initiatives play a lead role in improving maternal and child health, such as reducing infant mortality, increasing access to care, improving health equity, and improving coordinated care for children and youth with special healthcare needs (CYSHCN). ODH is currently engaged in year four of the five-year block grant cycle (federal fiscal years 2021-2025) and is submitting its plans for the fourth year (fiscal year 2024, October 2023-September 2024). The 2020 Maternal and Child Health Needs Assessment provided the foundation for the development of priorities and the five-year Action Plan. Please visit the Title V website listed below to find a report on the MCH Needs Assessment and more information on the Action Plan development.

To further strengthen ongoing stakeholder and partner engagement, each year the Ohio Title V program solicits feedback and input via a public comment survey regarding priorities and strategies across the life course population domains: women, infants, children, adolescents, and children with special healthcare needs. Results are used to help inform priorities and strategies that frame the work conducted throughout the five-year cycle to improve health outcomes for the MCH population.

This survey is an opportunity for you to provide input. The survey will be open until May 31, 2023. We encourage you to take time to share your comments.
