 - a) Expansion gap
 - Amy -We continue working on our plan to fill the funding gap. We have talked with state partners who are interested in helping HBAH. Currently not seeing a way to get enough money to fully fund HBAH 2.0 from state funds alone. One area we are looking into is looking to work with Medicaid managed care plans. MMCP for the first year of this new programming will have less money available because of their startup costs, but more will be available later, if we have their support. This will take time and be a significant effort to get this to align. COHHIO is open to suggestions and are working to avoid taking any from any possible local match moneys for our partners during this funding search.
 - Gina- We are also looking into One Time Strategic Community Investments Fund (Fund 5AY1) dollars. These are very flexible dollars that will most likely be rolled out around capital budget but could possibly be rolled out closer to November election.

Additionally, the federal process is starting out for next year. Sharrod Brown asks for community projects to be invested in and has reached out specifically about HBAH for the next round of possible funding.

- Sarah Hackenbracht GDAHA – It could be helpful to look into the [Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee \(PDAC\)](#). Who assist in establishing regional priorities for funding public projects that benefit the economic development, health, education or quality of life in the region. The PDAC process involves coordination by representatives from the Dayton Region’s business community, local government, education, and civic organizations.

(1) Believes each economic development region in the state has a similar entity and process. It may be worth looking at the current HBAH model from a regional perspective to determine what resources would need to be marshalled from each region to roll into the statewide research effort.
