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

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

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HIC/PIT Count Federal Requirements



HIC

An annual housing inventory count which provides an overview of a community's homeless program inventory







PIT

A count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons in a community

How HUD Requirements are Implemented



Role of Providers in HIC/PIT Count

Projects review and update HIC information for their project(s) and submit significant updates/changes to COHHIO.

conduct Unsheltered and All Projects conduct Sheltered PIT Counts

Non-HMIS Participating
Projects work with
County Contacts to review
and update HIC
information as needed.

Role of County Contacts in HIC/PIT Count



One County Contact per region

Primary contact for all HIC/PIT correspondence

Assists in HIC/PIT data submission for Non-HMIS Participating Projects

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2024 HIC Components

The HIC includes inventory and capacity information on all programs dedicated to serving homeless persons in a community, regardless of the source of funding. This includes:

- Emergency Shelters
- Transitional Housing
- Rapid Re-Housing
- Joint TH-RRH
- Permanent Supportive Housing

2024 HIC Data Collection and Review Process




- The number and type of beds or units on the HIC represents the inventory available in the project on a typical day, not just those in use during the PIT Count (except for RRH).
- The number of beds or units should not fluctuate monthly or weekly.

2024 HIC Data Collection and Review Process

- HIC data is entered in HMIS by COHHIO for all homeless dedicated projects in the BoSCoC for HMIS Participating and Non-participating projects.
- The Ohio BoSCoC will use current housing inventory information as entered in HMIS for most projects
- COHHIO will post summary of current HMIS inventory for providers to review
- COHHIO will also reach out directly to projects if updated HIC information is required

2024 HIC Data Collection and Review Process

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PIT Count Components

- A PIT Count provides data on the number and characteristics of people who are homeless in a community.
- A PIT Count must be an unduplicated count using statistically reliable methods.
- All BoSCoC communities must collect the basic HUD-required data but can collect additional data they deem as appropriate.
- A complete list of the types of data collected can be found in the Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care 2024 Housing Inventory Count and Point-in-Time Guidance

PIT Count Components

Sheltered Count

- Emergency Shelters
- Transitional Housing
- Persons residing in hotels/motels (paid for by public or private organizations for purposes of providing emergency shelter)
- Extreme weather shelters/cold shelters, seasonal shelters



Reminder: People in PSH and RRH are not included in the PIT Count but data for these projects must be recorded for the HIC.

PIT Count Components




Unsheltered Count

- This count includes persons who, on the night of the count, are living in a place not designed for or not ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Includes persons staying in cars, encampments, or abandoned buildings.

PIT Count Data


The Ohio BoSCoC will use HMIS and Counting Us app to collect and report PIT Count data.

Sheltered PIT data

- HMIS Participating Projects -COHHIO will run reports on currently-entered data.
- Non-HMIS Participating Projects –
 will use the Counting Us app to
 complete PIT surveys with clients on
 the night of the PIT.


Unsheltered PIT data


2024 PIT Count Collection App

Geographic Sampling


- An approach that involves conducting unsheltered PIT Counts in a select number of areas on the night of the PIT Count
- A CoC-wide unsheltered PIT Count is then generated from that sample of data




All communities are still encouraged to do unsheltered outreach on the night of the PIT Count



If sampling is done accurately, both these methods can produce accurate estimates of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness.








2024 PIT Count Collection App

Alternatives for those who prefer to do a full county canvas

- Counties that have the ability and capacity to do a full county canvas can enter all data into the Counting Us app
- The full CoC-wide unsheltered number will be populated using the sampling approach
- However, communities that want to know how many people in their entire county are experiencing unsheltered homelessness can enter data outside high/low probability census tracts


Known Locations Survey

- Will be used in advance of the count to identify potential high probability census tracts
- Helps identify up to date locations where you think you will find people experiencing unsheltered homelessness on the night of the PIT count
- County Contacts are responsible for identifying these areas
 - Nothing is required of specific projects for this
 - · Work with County Contact if you know of a location that should be submitted
- Known Locations surveys must be submitted in Counting Us app by Friday, December 15th

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Changes for 2024

- Per 2024 HMIS Data Standards updates, HUD now allows the following race/ethnicity responses:
 - 1. American Indian, Alaska Native, or Indigenous
 - 2. Asian or Asian American
 - 3. Black, African American, or African
 - 4. Hispanic/Latina/e/o
 - 5. Middle Eastern or North African
 - Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander
 - 7. White

Changes for 2024

- Per 2024 HMIS Data Standards updates, HUD now allows the following gender responses:
 - 1. Woman (girl if child)
 - 2. Man (boy if child)
 - 3. Culturally Specific Identify (e.g., Two-Spirt)
 - 4. Transgender
 - 5. Questioning
 - 6. Different Identity

Service-Based Count

What is a service-based count?

 People experiencing homelessness who access social services (homelessness services, food pantries, soup kitchens, libraries, etc) are asked about where they slept on the designated PIT night.

When can it occur?

• Up to 7 days after the PIT night

- Communities are allowed to do service-based counts this year
- Work with County Contact to coordinate
- Must notify BoS staff of intent to do service-based count

2024 Timeline Sheltered PIT Count for HMIS Participating Projects

| January 22, 2024 | Check data quality in Rme for issues. |
|---|---|
| by January 22, 2024 (before the PIT Count) | Make sure entry/exits dates have been entered for all clients. |
| by January 25, 2024 (after the PIT Count) | Again, check to make sure entry/exit dates have been entered for all clients. |
| February 8, 2024 | COHHIO HMIS staff will pull reports for sheltered PIT data for January 23. |

2024 Timeline Sheltered PIT Count for Non-HMIS Participating Projects

December 6, 2023 January 22, 2024

Providers download Counting Us app, and participate in any training and technical assistance regarding use of app

Providers collect information on every client who stayed in their program on the night of January 23, and enter into Counting Us app

2024 Timeline Unsheltered PIT Count

| December 15, 2023 | Known Locations surveys submitted in Counting Us app |
|---|--|
| January 4, 2024 | PIT Count Training Webinar (Map of high/low probability census tracts made available) |
| December 6, 2023 - January 22, 2024 | Select communities organize PIT Count, download Counting Us app, and participate in any additional training and technical assistance regarding use of app. |
| January 23, 2024 - January 24, 2024 8:00 pm - 6:00 am | Select communities conduct Street Count. |
| January 24, 2024– January 30, 2024 | Communities wishing to conduct service-based count (and who have notified COHHIO in advance) collect data on those experiencing unsheltered homelessness on the night of 1/23/24, and who slept in a high/low probability census tract |
