


What is a Continuum of Care (CoC)?

Continuum of Care (CoC)

The federally recognized homeless system for a geography



Name of the federal homeless assistance program (HUD's CoC Program)



Organized
homelessness
response
(Ohio BoSCoC)




Group of representatives (local/regional CoC)

Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care

This CoC is called the Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care.

Within these 80 counties, there are approximately 400 homeless programs including emergency shelter, transitional housing, rapid re-housing, and permanent supportive housing.

The Ohio Balance of State Continuum of Care (BoSCoC) has divided these 80 counties into 17 homeless planning regions.



ODOD -> Ohio BoSCoC has been competitively awarded multiple rounds of YHDP funding, including Round 7

Ohio Balance of State Round 7

- Applied June 2023, awarded September 2023
- Regions 2, 3, 5, 9, 11, and 14
- 32 counties
- \$5.16 million
- Considered a rural project award
- One of 16 communities awarded, along with Akron/Summit County CoC

Basic Award Info

- All YHDP grants are for 2 years, except planning grants which are for 1 year
 - There is no limit to the number of projects a community can submit; the only limit is that funding across all projects cannot exceed total YHDP award.
- Communities can be innovative as they create projects that meet youth-defined needs
 - YHDP communities can implement several special YHDP activities outside of the regular CoC regulations.



YHDP is Youth-Led

- Youth and young adults (YYA) with lived experience of homelessness must lead the process and have decisionmaking power.
- The identities and experiences of YYA included in our YHDP process should be representative of those who experience homelessness in our CoC.
 - Black, Indigenous, and YYA of Color must be included in this process
 - LGBTQ+ YYA must be included in this process
- Tokenization, or inviting YYA to "check the youth collaboration box," is not authentic youth collaboration.

Phases of YHDP



Planning (September 2023-March 2024)

- Engage in a <u>youth-led</u>, community-wide
 planning process to envision what you need to end youth homelessness across CoC
- Put that into a
 Coordinated
 Community Plan (CCP)
 that HUD must approve
 before accessing YHDP
 funding



YHDP Project Selection Spring - Summer 2024

 Based on what is decided in the planning process, determine which entities will run new projects using YHDP funding



Project Implementation & Systems-Change 2024-beyond

- Transform local work to end youth homelessness
- Start up new projects
- Get started on steps in the action plan from the CCP



The Coordinated Community Plan

- Mission, vision, & action plan for ending youth homelessness
- Youth-led governance & decision-making structure
- List of new projects to be funded by YHDP & other entities



- > 80% of YHDP award allocated toward this project type
- ➤ This project prioritizes a quick transition out of homelessness and into short term and/or permanent housing by providing up to 24 months in the TH component and up to 36 months (with a special YHDP activity) of housing and supportive services in the RRH component.
- ➤ This project serves YYA single and family households experiencing category 1,2, and 4 of the HUD homelessness definition including youth under age 18 and ages 18-24.



- > The TH component will operate as a short-term crisis housing option
 - Site-based or scattered-site, including possible use of hotel/motel if necessary
 - > Total of at least 50 units in the YHDP site
 - Estimated average length of stay of 1-3 months
- > RRH will create new permanent housing opportunities
 - Project-based or scattered site and can offer shared housing options for YYA that want and need it
 - > Total of at least 50 units in the YHDP site
 - > YYA as the leaseholder or the agency as the lease holder (eg, master lease)
- ➤ TH-RRH supportive services must be of be high quality, appropriate for youth, and housing focused.

What does this look like?



CAA of Columbiana County

- TH: 4 BR house, 3 BR house
- SOAR-trained navigators
- Avg LOS 45-55 days

New Projects: Crisis Response Outreach and Housing Navigation Support (SSO)

- > 20% of YHDP award allocated to this project type
- ➤ This project provides mobile wraparound crisis response designed to quickly resolve issues that are currently or will soon result in homelessness.
- Outreach and housing navigators will coordinate with CE Access Points to connect YYA to housing-focused support, with a focus on YYA fleeing dangerous situations and/or YYA experiencing unsheltered homelessness.



New Projects: Crisis Response Outreach and Housing Navigation Support (SSO)

Services to be available include

- Annual assessment
- Case management
- Childcare
- Moving costs
- Case management
- Education services
- Job training
- Food
- Housing search & counseling services

- Legal services
- Life skills
- Mental health services
- Outpatient
- Outreach services
- Substance abuse prevention services
- Transportation
- Utility Deposits



- Services to be available = provided by lead agency or by another community partner via MOU.

- Case mgmt. and navigation is very difficult without housing options
- Outreach via CE has been a challenge

Letter of Interest - LOI

- Prepares you and the CoC Project Selection Workgroup for your response to the RFP
- Helps identify additional areas of need
 - Capacity to partner with YYA
 - Training/TA on project types
 - Outreach to different communities and types of providers
- Requirement in order to respond to the RFP

Eligibility to Submit an LOI

- Be a non-profit organization or unit of local government
- Have experience administering federal and/or state funds, and be in good standing with current funders
- Have experience administering programs and services that assist people experiencing homelessness and/or housing crises, and/or programs serving youth and young adults
- Demonstrate commitment to youth-led, youth-centered programming
- Have experience administering programs in at least one of the 32 counties included in the Round 7 award area
 - Applicants selected to administer YHDP projects will be required to accept program participants through the Ohio BoSCoC coordinated entry process.
 - Applicants will also be expected to participate in ongoing Continuous Quality
 Improvement (CQI) work and system planning with the R7 YHDP Team and Continuum of Care throughout the duration of administration of the YHDP project.
 - Projects must use HMIS.
- Have participated in some element of planning to develop the Round 7
 BoSCoC CCP


Key considerations

- ✓ YHDP projects must ensure the provision of a crisis TH/ES option if an applicant only applies for the SSO project in a particular area. Remember that the primary goal of YHDP is housing.
- ✓ Commitment to staff training toward youth-centered implementation of appropriate youth-dedicated services is critical.
- ✓ Project partners who are new to HUD, CoC, and/or YHDP projects can receive training and technical assistance to ensure they are operating programs within HUD rules.

Timeline



April 5 – CoC submits CCP to HUD

April 15 – LOIs Due

End of April – confirm CCP accepted by HUD, release RFP

May 31 – RFPs for new projects due

Mid-June – new projects selected

June 28 – new projects submitted in esnaps

July-September – project implementation support

September 30 – funds obligated to new projects
