Questions for state candidates

1. Homelessness

On any given night, nearly 11,000 Ohioans are experiencing homelessness—sleeping outside or in an emergency shelter or transitional housing program. What should the state do to help end homelessness? To effectively address homelessness in Ohio, the state should implement a multifaceted approach that includes increasing affordable housing options, expanding access to mental health and addiction services, and enhancing support systems for low-income families. Investing in permanent supportive housing and rapid rehousing programs can provide stability for those in need. Additionally, fostering collaboration between local governments, non-profit organizations, and community stakeholders can facilitate the development of comprehensive services tailored to the unique needs of the homeless population. By focusing on prevention, support, and long-term solutions, Ohio can make significant strides toward ending homelessness.

Each OHTF dollar generate over \$8 in economic activity. The OHTF has been historically funded through a 50-50 split with county recorders fees, but revenues have declined in

recent years. Do you believe the state should ensure sufficient revenue for the OHTF? If so, how? Yes, the state should ensure sufficient revenue for the Ohio Housing Trust Fund (OHTF) to maintain and expand its critical role in supporting affordable housing and homelessness programs. This can be achieved by diversifying the funding sources beyond the current reliance on county recorder fees, which have proven to be unstable. The state could consider implementing a dedicated percentage of specific tax revenues, such as real estate transaction taxes or property taxes, to create a more stable funding stream. Additionally, advocating for increased state budget allocations and exploring public-private partnerships can enhance resources available for the OHTF. Ensuring consistent and robust funding will help maximize the economic impact of each dollar invested and address the pressing housing needs of Ohioans.
